2. SPECIAL EVENTS**2.1 Registration**

Registration for all special events must be submitted in writing.

2.2 Cancellation

Cancellation of a registration must occur in writing.

2.2.1 Summer Intensive Study Program / Winter Intensive Study Program

In case of notice to drop studies, the following fees will be refunded:

- If cancellation occurs at least three weeks before the start of courses: 50 % refund.
- Later cancellation: no refund.
- If a medical certificate is submitted: 100 % refund less a CHF 200.00 processing fee.
- After the first day of the course, no reimbursement of the tuition fee.

2.2.2 Meetings, symposia

- In case of notice to cancel attendance submitted at least seven days before the beginning of an event, a processing fee of CHF 60.00 will be charged.
- If the notice to cancel attendance occurs later than seven days before the event begins or the student fails to attend, we will charge the entire amount.
- After the first day of the course, no reimbursement of the tuition fee.

3. INSURANCE

4. EXPENSES

All bank charges shall be borne by the customer.

5. MONEY TRANSFER / PAYMENT OF THE FEES
